



Le Meridien Al Aqah Beach Resort collaborates with Official Authorities to launch Coral Reef Garden Project



The Ministry of Climate Change and Environment, MoCCAE, under the patronage of Crown Prince of Fuiairah H.H. Sheikh Mohammed bin Hamad bin Mohammed Al Shargi, Dr. Thani bin Ahmed Al Zevoudi. Minister of Climate Change and Environment in line with the Ministry's strategy to protect the UAE's biodiversity and ensure its sustainability, launched reef garden project on coral Saturday, April 13th which is set to include the cultivation of 1.5 million coral reef colonies over the course of next five years.

The launched event held at Le Merdien Al Aqah Beach Resort organized by the Ministry of Climate

Change and Environment, in partnership with Fujairah Municipality, Dibba Fujairah Municipality and Fujairah Adventures was attended by Crown Prince of Fujairah H.H. Sheikh Mohammed bin Hamad bin Mohammed Al Sharqi and Minister of Climate Change and Environment, Dr Thani Al Zeyoudi along with other officials.

While addressing the attendees Dr Thani Al Zeyoudi said "Protecting and preserving the sustainability of the environment and of our natural resources is integral to the legacy of the founding father of the UAE, Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan".

"The preservation of the country's biodiversity is also a prime area of focus for the UAE leadership today as outlined in the UAE Vision 2021. The Ministry of Climate Change and Environment has put in place multiple programs that aim to carry out the country's national strategy for biodiversity

in collaboration with other local environmental authorities in the country."

He added that the Fujairah Cultured Coral Reef Gardens project that spans 300,000 square meters will include the cultivation of 1.5 million coral reef colonies and significantly boost the sustainability of the fish stocks, thereby safeguarding food diversity and food security in the country. "The protection of fish within the coral reefs will allow it to breed and grow. The Ministry is keen on promoting the project as an ecotourism destination. It is also anticipated to encourage the spirit of volunteerism and community work as the cultivation of the coral reefs will depend heavily on the volunteering efforts of the youth."

Dr. Al Zeyoudi also said that the Ministry has organised several specialised workshops for young volunteers to offer insights on the cultivation of coral reefs and their sustainability. All participants were awarded certificates by the Ministry.

Hassan Salem Al Yammahi, Director of Dibba Fujairah Municipality urged individuals to play their part for collectively results, said successful conservation requires a team effort.

"Effective conservation of the marine environment requires the collective efforts of government authorities, fishermen, beachgoers and the tourism sector as a whole. Therefore, Dibba Fujairah Municipality is keen to develop ecotourism and ensure its sustainability through working together with its partners in the public and private sectors to protect the natural wealth of the area. Initiatives in this regard include the installation of artificial caves to deflect underwater currents and provide a safe environment for marine organisms to breed."

One of the key objectives of the gardens is to protect local fish species and boost their population. By protecting fish eggs against predators in the sea as well as shielding them from water currents will help increase the population of local fish species in the region.





Crown Prince opens Asia-Pacific Judo Championships



The Asia-Pacific Judo Championships Seniors held in Fujairah under the patronage of H.H. Sheikh Mohammed bin Hamad Al Sharqi, Crown Prince of Fujairah, Chairman of the Fujairah Martial Arts Club, who attended the inaugural ceremony at the Zayed Sports Complex, Fujairah along with H.H Sheikh Hamad bin Mohammed Al Sharqi, (eldest son of the Crown Prince) in the presence of 286 players from 39 Asian countries, including 11 Arab nations

H.H. The stadium will be built in accordance with the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) and Fifa standards.

It is hoped the 300,000 square metre, international standard, 9,000-seater stadium will prove a boost for tourism and community activities.

Dibba football club, the Arabian Gulf League side, currently ground shares with Fujairah SC and fans are delighted they will have a facility closer to home.

UAE launches world's first Ministry of Possibilities

The UAE has unveiled a new branch of government, a Ministry of Possibilities.

The United Arab Emirates has unveiled a new branch of government, a Ministry of Possibilities, three years after launching a department in charge of happiness.

Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al-Maktoum, the UAE's premier and ruler of Dubai, said the "unconventional" ministry would function "without a minister" but with input from the whole cabinet.

Taking to Twitter, Sheikh
Mohammed said the
"unconventional ministry" will be staffed with
cabinet members.

Sheikh Mohammed also issued directives to start working on the first phase of a number of national programmes in the form of four departments. These include the departments of Anticipatory services, Behavioural rewards, UAE talent and Government procurement.

The virtual ministry, administered by the cabinet, will address pressing national portfolios and build future government systems.

It would also cut waiting times for government services, according to the Dubai government's media office.

The department will bring together a team from different ministries and public entities to develop an approach for incentivising positive behaviour through a point-based "rewards" system and individuals will be able to collect points that can be used in payments for government services.

The Ministry's Department of UAE Talent will create a nurturing environment to empower




Emiratis to be part of the country's journey and contribute to designing the future.

The department will develop tools to identify talent of all ages and from all social segments and create innovative channels to enable citizens to develop their skills and talent for the service of their country.

It will create a framework for talent development and analysis, create an evaluation mechanism and collaborate with companies to provide necessary support.

The Department of Government Procurement aims to develop a radically new approach for government procurement that will make procurement faster and more accessible, especially for small and medium enterprises (SMEs).

The department aims to create an easy-to-use government procurement platform based on the latest developments in digital markets that will help promote SMEs and improve government cost effectiveness. In 2016, the UAE created Ministries of Happiness and Tolerance.



The Food of Ramadan



In the Holy Month of Ramadan, Iftar is the most awaited meal that people look forward to after the day long fasting. Traditionally, the fast is broken with dates and laban followed by the delicious and nutritious spread of Iftar meal. All over the world, the Iftar meal overflows with a variety of local delicacies and the UAE is no exception when it comes to tasty traditional dishes during the Holy Month of Ramadan.



Laban and dates: Breaking the fast with *laban* and dates is perhaps the most traditional method of all, as the Prophet Muhammad broke his fast with these humble offerings before praying. They are a regular sight on *lftar* tables, and the high sugar and vitamin content has many physical benefits too.

Lentil Soup: It's customary to gently ease into eating again before the real feasting begins. Salad is a good way of doing this, although the more usual way is to grab a smooth and velvety, protein-packed bowl of hot lentil soup finished with a good squeeze of fresh lemon juice to give it a light and refreshing feel. The warming soup relaxes the stomach after a day of fasting and offers a good source of fibre. Alternatively, bilhamoud and shorat are other types of soup made from ground lentils and served with Jordanian, Syrian and Lebanese salad.



Kabsa: This is a traditional Saudi Arabian rice dish that is a staple in the Arab homes. Although it is considered indigenous to Saudi Arabia, it is a commonly served dish all over the Middle East. *Kabsa* is usually made with grilled or barbecued meat/poultry served on a bed of long grain rice cooked in stock with whole spices. The popular choice of meat/poultry for *kabsa* is chicken, lamb, beef or camel. It is usually served with a side salad and a homemade Arabic tomato sauce.

Stew: A rich meat stew dish packed with nutritious pulses and slow-releasing starchy vegetables slow cooked resulting in a tenderly cooked meat stew with a balanced flavour. An appetising Ramadan dish easily digestible.

Local News



Harees: This local delicacy can be found on Emirati tables throughout the year, but still is a regular *Iftar* feature. Shredded pieces of slow-cooked lamb and a mulch of boiled wheat are vigorously pounded together with a heavy stick, or crushed in a wooden press with proper seasoning and a generous a topping of ghee/clarified butter. The heavy porridge consistency dish usually constitutes a meal in itself, but over Ramadan it provides the base upon which other dishes are served, and is sometimes flavoured with cinnamon and cumin.

Lamb Ouzi: A must-try Iftar dish! Lamb Ouzi is a spectacular dish! The whole lamb is marinated for 24 hours with a special marinade to give the lamb a unique, juicy flavour. Traditionally, the animal is spit-grilled whole having been hollowed out and stuffed with a mixture of spiced rice and nuts.

Similar in style to an Indian biryani, *Ouzi* is often presented as the centre piece of an Iftar feast.





Kepsa Bel Sanak: Salty fish and seafood are generally avoided during Ramadan, as it is thought to make fasters thirsty. However, some buffets will feature *Kepsa Bel Sanak* – a sort of fragrant rice and fish casserole flavoured with cumin and peppers. Dishes vary, but they generally have a distinctly Arabic flavour to them; including hot and cold *mezze*, *shawarma*, and a wide variety of kehabs

Gamet Jallab: Given the desert climate, abstaining from water during the daylight hours is serious business, and refreshing drinks form a crucial part of the *Iftar* dinner. A plethora of multicoloured liquid delights are on offer to quench

the most parched palate. The deep gamet jallab is a mixture of grape extracts. rosewater and sugar, poured over ice and finished off with floating pine nuts. Tamarind is a rootbased drink meaning 'Indian date', made from the fruit pods of trees native to Asia, and has a distinctive sweet taste. A more substantial drink is ayran, a lassi-like voghurt-based drink. diluted and flavoured with mint.







Umm Ali: Since it's included in practically every brunch in the UAE, we are all familiar with Egypt's answer to bread and butter pudding. A creamy dessert of is made with buttery, flaky puff pastry, almonds, pine nuts and pistachios and a personal favourite!

Be sure to try an *Iftar* during Ramadan, you may even be invited to someone's home... a great experience... not to be missed!



Handling job interviews: Previously, job interviews were mostly based on answering some questions about on-job-performance. Now it's different. There is a panel of interviewers who wants to know more about your inter personal

skills, how you handle work pressure, can you solve unusual problems, can you handle conflict effectively, how you convince your boss to take a course of action which you think is right.

Can you think outside the box, etc. Believe me all of us do that during our jobs. The only difference is somebody can explain it better while most can't. Some people can answer tough questions with smile on their faces while most get confused. It's not difficult once you train your mind to respond to interview questions rather reacting to them. Toastmasters International teaches you that!

Career transformation: Previously, career transformation was a seldom spoken topic. An engineer would retire as an engineer and an accountant would retire as accountant. Now it's different. An accountant may want to progress his career as manager operations. An ISO auditor may want to be an entrepreneur.

Guess what, I have quoted these two examples from real life. The two gentlemen who made outstanding career transformations were themselves toastmasters. Over time they realized that their current job was good but the spark of being passionate about what they do was missing. Being TMI member, they met experts to guide them about new field, likely challenges they would face and how to overcome them. TMI lets you explore yourself!

Conclusion:

Modern corporate world poses challenges. These challenges can be tough unless we develop certain soft skills. Best way to do that is by joining a forum where these skills are taught. Toastmasters International is 'the' forum which professionals should look forward to join. Sooner the better!

Discovering Wadi Dafta Plantation



Nestled at the base of the rugged Hajar mountains lies a unique nursery that is nurturing and producing a wide variety of rare and diverse plants.

The emirate of Fujairah is known for its mountains and wadis, natural springs but little is known

about its expanding acres of plantations. The Wdai Dafta Plantation is located approximately 20 kms outside Fujairah city on the Masafi Road.

The Wadi Dafta Plantation was founded by Ahmed Alhefeiti who gave Fujairah Observer a personal insight into his passion and vision for the future.

Ahmed a retired Lt.
Colonel who also
served as Deputy
Executive Director of Al
Sharg Healthcare is a

well known figure in Fujairah but this last year has seen him completely consumed with his "green" project.

Ahmed family origins are from the Fujairah Village of Sakamkam, with their traditional background being agriculture so you could say plants are in

his blood. One thing for sure is you will rarely find anyone in Fujairah that talks so passionately and with such great knowledge on the subject of plants. Ahmed purposely located the plantation on the wadi to provide his dreams with what he believes are essential to cultivating a variable array of plantation.

These three essentials are soil, water and environment (his own designed- regulated air system).

A tremendous amount of early work was required to replace the subsoil which was extremely rocky but he provide his own blend of nutritious soil, tapping into local fresh water and even then with his own purification balancing it to give a constant clean and healthy flow of H2O and finally shielding





and regulating temperatures to facilitate a stable air environment with temperature control.

Ahmed has embraced social media to both highlight and market the Wadi Dafta Plantation and we were amazed by not only his huge following but his knowledgeable customers who come from a far, even on the day we visited Mohammed Salah (a regular visitor to the plantation) had driven from Saudi Arabia to purchase some of his rare plants.

Plants come from around the world from countries such as Korea, Thailand, Poland, Ukraine, Nepal, India, China, South Africa, Bangladesh, Kenya, Pakistan, Brazil, Philippines to name a few.

Ahmed will collect his plants on his travels, packing carefully in specialise bags (following strict UAE regulations) but often people will contact him when they have something that might be special.

Rare cactus, a vast array of fruit, papayas, bananas, pineapples, berries, tomatoes, spice and herbs are in abundance. The several varieties of mint he has include a chocolate flavour and a banana flavour, whilst also nurturing rare yellow strawberries, red bananas, coffee plants and even plants that are beneficial for cancer sufferers. The list is endless...

One of his most exciting projects which is in its infancy, his 35 varieties of figs which will he reliably informs us with bear fruit in 12 months. It even has its own WhatsApp Group as fig aficionados chat about the varieties.

One project is the grafting of a citrus and a wood apple. It's not been done before but Ahmed enthuses as he shows the project has clearly worked.

For me the most interesting was the growing of vegetation for animal feed, Azolla, which is very rich in protein, vitamins, and minerals. This small plant floating in water (does not need soil) has the incredible ability to double its biomass every couple of days makes it an economically a great organic product.

We must stress the whole farm is organic and any pests are removed laboriously by hand.



Ahmed has strong views on the UAE producing more of it's own food. He stresses that the climate here is perfect to grow most things especially in the cooler months. He is embracing modern cultivation practices which will boost contributions to local food supply.

I loved everything about the place! The ambience, the setting, the dim lights at night time, the rays of sunlight in mid afternoon beautifying the tables.




And most definitely - the food was simply yum! Even their signature hot chocolate had a taste of orange in it. Also, the company was great!

The Retreat - the Best Place for a Holistic Holiday



Behind the façade of an unsuspecting parameter wall in Fujairah, Al Bidya, I found a "Secret Garden" with a lush, verdant interior. And with that passing through the large wooden door that serves as the main entrance, I had shed that workaholic persona of mine like a heavy coat.

The owners of The Retreat understand the everevolving demands of modern life, decided to create the Retreat because they understood there was a need for people – in this day and age of near total technological immersion – to 'take a break', 'to escape to a spiritual place, to reconnect with nature and break away from the crowded corporate city lifestyle.'

The Retreat is different to an ordinary hotel franchise; there's none of that uniform copypaste style that makes these hotels nearly indistinguishable from one another, with a possibility of leaving the guest unable to even guess what location they are in. It, on the contrary, has a distinguishable character with a unique ambience, that includes coarse natural textures,

hand-carved furniture, ubiquitous inlaid stones – plucked from where they once lay resting on the land itself, instead of being harvested from the mountains. Every structure was built using either natural or recycled materials from the surrounding area.

There are interlocking wooden beams with roofed canopies woven from local palm tree leaves, the floor is constructed from 90-year-old imported pine wood which had until recently served as railway sleeper (or railroad ties). This is a place that has been crafted and decorated with great attention to detail; the tools used in the construction have been re-purposed as hanging works of art and there is even a 'sculpture' made from a piece of miscellaneous machinery present near the common area.

The Retreat, therefore, serves as a port of entry to a time when the senses were still in harmony with nature's inaudible rhythms. Where beauty had a different kind of significance and didn't conjure up images of neo-futuristic concrete jungles, but instead the simplicity of a crackling bonfire, the pinprick glow of the stars at midnight, the chirping of birds coming alive with a molten-gold sunrise, and of the joy of another human's company

without the superfluous barriers of technology or WiFi. The Retreat is intended as a truly organic experience, welcoming all those who are burned out by partaking in the so-called 'rat-race.'

Everything here is done organically and with great emphasis put on sustainability and low carbon emissions/footprint – something the owners hope will inspire future generations. They favour ecofriendly lighting, and the use of solar panels to run their irrigation system. Water purification is all done on site and you can even see the well in the centre of the courtyard flanked by fruit trees and other plants.

One of the more notable plants grown here, for instance, is the astounding Kiri Tree or Imperial Paulownia. Originally grown in South-East Asia, it has now been cultivated into a hybrid by a German organization called Kiri Projects Development. This hybrid of Kiri Tree is much more temperature-resistant and produces up to 6 kilos of oxygen per day whilst being beneficial in the facilitation of climate control.

You can also find a plethora of other plant life; The Retreat has its own selection of fruit trees; orange, banana, fig, papaya and mango. Amongst the vegetables, there's tomato, cucumber, rocca and the miraculous cure-all, moringa. Moringa is rich in antioxidants and aids in problems such as anaemia, rheumatism, headaches and thyroid disorders.

There's currently 65 trees altogether, but it's the owners goal to have at least 600 trees available within the next 3 years. They want guests to pluck their own fruit from these trees – like a veritable island paradise. The Retreat uses their own harvest when preparing the meals that they provide for their guests.

In order to immerse myself in the experience, I decided to spend a night there. My activities ranged from leisurely walks through the interwoven walkways, admiring the looming Al Hajar Mountain ranges in the distance, or simply the smell of the fresh vegetation all around. I had the most wonderful sleep in the canopied tent that we stayed in – and slept on a bed made of fragrant anti-bacterial sheets, the first of its kind to be imported to the UAE from Germany.

Then there was dinner by the campfire, where it began to drizzle lightly. Followed by a tour of their quaint little library and of the 'art section' where

hiking, mountain climbing, kayaking and off-road cycling.

There are also prearranged weight-loss/ gain and detoxification programs organized by an expert dietician, which includes exercise programs catered to your specific requirements.

In short, it's not just about relaxing and putting away the phone; it's about reconnecting with oneself on a holistic level, mind, body and spirit (one's self). It's about setting an imperative re-set button.

anyone can readily grab a canvas and some paint and unleash their inner artist, something which can prove to be very therapeutic and relaxing. Their shower facilities are wonderful; I especially loved the sink made from natural stone. There really is a sense of Zen-like tranquillity present.

Other activities on offer at The Retreat, for those wishing to stay a little longer; yoga sessions,

The Retreat is not only for adults to enjoy. I would say it's almost vital that children should partake in the experience. It is a chance for them to take a break from the continual buzz of their devices, reconnect with their instincts. To enjoy the outdoors and have a more visceral experience. They will learn the names of plants and discover the origin of many of the foods they consume; few

It will also teach them the value of sustainability as well as the benefits of eco-friendly living, knowledge which will prove invaluable in the years to come, as our world continues to evolve and experience its necessary ecological shift.



Homemade Food Can Be Fast Food ©Alva Carpenter

We all are inclined to enjoy a bit of junk food now and then but in a fast-paced life in the Gulf it is all too easy to get into the habit of living on expensive takeaways: which is unhealthy and fattening. Many young professionals tell me they hardly every cook a meal because they do not have the time. But you can make a meal quicker than the time it can take to get in the car and queue for a takeaway. Nutritionists worry about the high salt, sugar and fat content of takeaways; even if salad is included it is usually only there as a garnish.

It is all too easy with so much fast food available to decide not to cook but quick ready-made microwave meals can also be bland and soulless. If you can buy fast food really cheap it is because the ingredients too are just cheap and cheerful. They are over-flavoured with fat and salt and who knows what else. If it is fake, give it a break.

We can easily get into the habit of grazing on sugary snacks such as biscuits and cakes as well as salty snacks: and fizzy drinks. The key solution is to be able to make homemade food fast. Knowing how to put together simple healthy meals quickly is a skill we all need.

Home cooking need not be lavish or beautiful; homemade food is simple and functional, but it tastes good. Most children will say they love their mum's cooking best. Children watching you cook are picking up life skills. There is never a good reason for having a takeaway breakfast, as a healthy breakfast can be made in minutes. A light lunch can be made in ten minutes; a sandwich or salad or a bowl of soup with a roll. What our bodies want is simple nutrients from good quality food.

Our bodies are not looking for chemicals and preservatives found in food manufactured in a factory; they want homemade.



Homemade food always tastes good and is healthier.

To be able to put together simple healthy meals that do not take too much time is a skill we all need to save ourselves from junk food, takeaways and microwave dinners.

While there are many cookery programmes on television which are great entertainment the food is often produced to impress and contains far too many ingredients not found in most home kitchens. So, while we enjoy watching we don't get around to making them ourselves.

Home cooking is about simple tastes and nutritious family meals. It really is not food to impress; it is just time to eat. When you cook for yourself you know what is in your food and you are eating fresh food and so are not adding preservatives additives or chemicals.

Local food also tastes better

I am in favour of fresh local ingredients. Fresh local tomatoes are cheaper and taste better than those who have travelled thousands of air miles. Recently on a family holiday on a Mediterranean island my children loved the taste of tomatoes ripened in the sun because they were so full of ruby red juice and tasted so sweet. Tomatoes were grown on the island and picked that morning.

Many perfectly shaped tomatoes in supermarkets have travelled thousands of miles to reach the Gulf and are often picked green before they have had chance to ripen in the sun. Vegetables and fruit ripened in the sun always taste better.

Food that has travelled miles is usually been irradiated

Irradiation involves eradicating bacteria, mould, insects and other pests by using electrical beams or X-rays, or gamma rays which are generated from the radioactive source Cobalt 60. This is done to give fruit and vegetables a long shelf life and to protect them during travel.

You cannot beat fresh food for flavour

If you can, get up early in the morning and go to the fish market and buy a freshly caught fish and bake it in the oven with a little olive oil and lemon juice. Nothing tastes better. Serve with rice and salad. It is a traditional healthy meal. In a study conducted by Southampton University in 2008, researchers confirmed that children who regularly eat certain preservatives and additives are more at risk for attention disorders such as hyperactivity and bad behaviour.

Finding quick easy healthy recipes

For my recipes for my columns I look for healthy meals that are colourful and easy and quick to make. Recipes that do not require too many ingredients so that most people will be able to make them. If you use fresh produce, then you don't need lots of ingredients and spices because the food has its own natural flavour that taste good. Casseroles and stews are great because they are made in one dish and all the flavours blend together. You can make enough for a few meals in one go. Recipes to look out for are ones that do not take a long time to prepare and do not contain too many ingredients.

Breakfast is probably the quickest and easiest meal to make. Lunch for us is usually soup and a bread roll or salad and a roll and then we usually eat our main meal in the evening as my children always come home from school starving.

Generally, eating out or takeaways are best regarded as an occasional treat.

Ask Alva

I am 25 and my hair is starting to thin which is worrying me very much. I do not want to take drugs as I am married and looking forward to starting a family. Can you suggest some natural options? I have heard it may be to do with the water, but I wonder if my hair loss may be due to my sales job as it is very stressful; my father has a full head of hair. *Patrick*.

Hair loss is more common in younger people than ever before. If your father has not lost his hair the cause may not be male pattern baldness. First check your diet and make sure you are eating a healthy diet with lots of protein. Take a quality supplement such as Permea Plus for hair skin and nails. 

How to overcome Aging

Everybody is interested in achievement, vouth. and beauty. Since the latter half of the 20th Century there has been an increasing focus on our appearance as a vehicle for identity and self-expression, with a greater recognition of the role of appearance and the desire for selfimprovement. Youth has become valued

and privileged above age and life experience.



Intrinsic aging processes include loss of skin elasticity and collagen, along with fat atrophy. Extrinsic factors, notably solar radiation, damage the dermis, with effects on collagen and elastic fibers. What can dermal fillers correct?

- Fill the line, crease.
- Fillers can also be used as "volumizers," plumping and lifting cheeks, chins, jawlines, and temples; filling out thin lips, and plumping sagging
- decrease or remove the shadow or wrinkle under the eyes caused by the lower eyelid
- fill in or soften the look of recessed scars

Hyaluronic Acid Fillers

Substances used in dermal fillers include:

- Calcium hydroxylapatite, which is a mineral-like compound found in bones.
- Hyaluronic acid, which is found in some fluids and tissues in the body that add plumpness to the skin.
- Polyalkylimide, a transparent gel that is compatible with the body.
- Polylactic acid, which stimulates the skin to make more collagen.
- Polymethyl-methacrylate microspheres (PMMA), a semi-permanent filler

The most popular category of wrinkle fillers is hyaluronic acid. Each type works in a slightly different way with varying results.

Side effects are rare but can include redness, swelling, and bruising at the injection site. The filler may also show up under the skin as tiny bumps. This is a problem that often improves over time

What is Botox?

Botox may help to correct dynamic wrinkles, such as crow's feet around the eyes and horizontal lines on the forehead.

Botox is a purified form of the botulinum toxin that is obtained from bacteria. Though it is deadly in larger amounts, the tiny, regulated amount of Botox given to correct wrinkles has been used safely for decades.

Botox works by blocking nerve signals in the muscles where it is injected. When those nerve signals are interrupted, the affected muscle is temporarily paralyzed or frozen. Without movement of these selected muscles in the face, certain wrinkles may be softened, reduced, or even removed.

What can Botox correct?

Botox only works on wrinkles that are caused by muscle movement. These are known as dynamic wrinkles, and are often called "expression lines." The most common dynamic wrinkles that Botox can treat are lines on the upper face, such as the "11" between the brows, horizontal lines on the forehead, and crow's feet around the eyes. These lines are caused by smiling, frowning, squinting, and other facial expressions.

What Things Botox Can Do-Other Than Relax Wrinkles?

- 1. Manage acne.
- 2. Get a temporary face-lift
- 3. Mimic a nose job
- 4. Soften your jawline and chin.
- 5. Tighten jowls.
- 6. Lift your lips
- 7. Smooth your neck.
- 8. Youth-ify your décolleté
- 9. Stop migraines.
- 10. Calm excessive sweating
- 11. Make blowouts last

Botox is not a permanent treatment. Repeated treatments are necessary for continued wrinkle-reducing effects. Most people find that the muscle-relaxing effect of Botox lasts for 3 to 6 months

What is a thread lift?

A thread lift is a type of procedure wherein temporary sutures are used to produce a subtle but visible "lift" in the skin. Instead of removing the patient's loose facial skin surgically. This has the effect of pulling the skin back slightly and therefore lifting and tightening the face. In addition to being ideal for lifting the skin, threads combat aging in another way: by provoking the body's "healing response" and causing the body to direct large surges of collagen to treated areas. This is important because of the vital role collagen plays in the aging process.

In other words, this process provides ongoing and progressive rejuvenation for the facial

tissues. Patients who have a thread lift for the purpose of stimulating collagen will notice a gradual improvement in their skin's tone and firmness. While their threads are in place, the body's healing response will be constantly activated because the body will want to "heal" the sutured areas and expel the sutures. The body is biologically programmed to react this way when it senses any foreign object present within the dermis. Fortunately, because the threads placed under the skin during a thread lift are so small, the patient will not feel any of this happening. Most people cannot feel their sutures at all once the skin has healed around them.

Recovery from a thread lift, on the other hand, is comparatively easy. Thread lifts can be performed under local, rather than general anesthesia, meaning that thread lift patients can drive themselves home and look after themselves immediately after having their procedure.

Thread lifts are low risk, thanks to how noninvasive they are. There is virtually no risk of scarring, severe bruising, bleeding or other complications after having a thread lift

While some patients will experience a little bit of soreness, redness and swelling after having a thread lift and therefore wish to take the rest of the day off, most can return to work immediately.

Other procedures also can be done as platelet rich plasma, chemical peeling, laser resurfacing and microdermabrasion to increase collagen products to improve the skin quality and minimize wrinkles for younger and lifted face.



to which the corporal replied, "don't you know that I am the corporal?" The stranger dismounted his horse and went to work with the soldiers to get the wood in position. Before leaving the scene, he said, dear corporal, "If you should need help again, call on Washington, your commander-inchief, and I will come." The horseman was none other than George Washington, the commander in chief of American colonies who were in a fierce battle against the British forces. Later he became the first president of USA.

The above incident reminds us that, leadership isn't shouting orders at your staff, it's helping them to minimize their burden. A manager who always order and put heavy burden on employees will be a failure to motivate those who under him. Leadership isn't shouting orders at your subordinates, instead being a part of them to lend a helping hand to execute their task.

Doyhambehere said her accomplishment was inspired by her partner, who joked she should try to run a marathon in her heels after watching her sprint to the car in the rain about a year ago.

Sewell said she trained in tennis shoes during the day and ran in her heels at night to prevent photos of her unusual footwear choice from going viral on social media before the marathon.

The runner, whose accomplishment raised funds for children's charity Koala, said she has submitted evidence of her run to Guinness World Records.



Wind leaves pontoon boat perched over dam

Stormy weather left a pontoon beat stranded on the edge of a North Carolina dam, and emergency officials said conditions are preventing them from removing it.

The Town of Columbus Fire Department posted drone photos to Facebook showing the unoccupied pontoon boat hanging over the edge of the Turner Shoals Dam on Lake Adger.

Polk County Emergency Management/Fire Marshal said the boat was not occupied when stormy weather carried it to the edge of the dam. Officials said the current lake level and windy conditions are preventing them from attempting to remove the boat, but they are monitoring conditions and plan to address the situation as soon as possible.





UAE girls power to glory in World Youth Jiu-Jitsu Championship

The future adult women's Jiu-Jitsu in the **UAE** and beyond is in safe hands following some thrilling action at the recent Abu Dhabi World Youth Jiu-Jitsu Championshipsdedicated competition for local and international vouth at the Abu Dhabi World



Professional Jiu-Jitsu Championship 2019 (ADWPJJC).

Held under theHis Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Deputy Supreme Commander of the UAE Armed Forces, day two of the ADWPJJC 2019 saw hundreds of girls aged 10-17, contest 73 age, weight and belt categories at Mubadala Arena in Abu Dhabi - the global home of Jiu-Jitsu.

finished second on 2,160 points with two gold, two silver and one bronze medal.

Australia finished third on 2,080 points with 15 wins resulting in one gold, two silver and three bronze medals.

The UAE's dominant girls received a further boost with a visit by H.H. Sheikh Mohammed bin Hamad Al Sharqi, Crown Prince of Fujairah, who was given a tour of the event by Abdulmunam Al Hashemi, Chairman of UAE Jiu-Jitsu Federation, President of Jiu-Jitsu Asian Union & Senior Vice President of Jiu-Jitsu International Federation.

H.H. Sheikh Mohammed also awarded medals to several winners, one of which was Nouf Khamis Al Balooshi, who won gold in the 63kg category for orange green belt Teens.

Among the VIPs watching the UAE girls take overall glory were Hussain bin Ibrahim Al Hammadi, Minister of Education; Mohammed Abdullah Al Junaidi, Head of Presidential Protocol, Ministry of Presidential Affairs; Maryam Eid Al Muhairi, Director General, Abu Dhabi Government Media Office; and Dr. Ali bin Tamim, Director General of Abu Dhabi Media Company.

"It was the dream of my life so far to win a gold medal and I'm so proud and honoured to have been given my medal by His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Hamad bin Mohammed Al Sharqi – I feel this is an honour for the whole UAE."

Al Balooshi's medal was one of many as the UAE's female youths produced powerful displays evoking the values of Jiu-Jitsu: tolerance, discipline, respect and determination. Amongst those demonstrating girl power was Shaikha Al Tamimi, 12 years, from Al Samha School, who took gold in the Junior, yellow belt, 75kg category.

"Winning the first place and the gold medal makes me feel like I was climbing a big mountain and I reached the top today, that was one of my ambitions. I did not expect to win and I'm so happy to get a gold medal I think my family will also be proud of me," said Al Tamimi.

Hamdah Alkalbani, representing Abu Dhabi's Al Wahda Club - Jiu-Jitsu Academy, was another Emirati youth to savour ultimate glory: "I am very happy to win first place and the gold medal," said Alkalbani, 13 years. "I did not expect to win, but I have been training twice a day to be ready for this championship. I love Jiu-Jitsu so much, it teaches



CLIMATE: The sun shines year round but Oct. to March, the days are pleasant (26°C, nights 15°C) Summer is April to Sept. and temperatures peak around 50°C with high humidity. The sun can be fierce so heatstroke, heat exhaustion are always a risk. Sunglasses, hats, and high factor sun creams are essential, especially for children.

DRESS: As in many Arab/Muslim countries dress should be modest. Wearing revealing tops or shorts in public places is not advisable.

CURRENCY: The dirham (pronounced dir-ham) is the U.A.E. official currency. Dirham notes are in 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500, and 1000 denominations. The dirham is divided into 100 fils. Coins are 1 dirham, 50, 25, 10 and 5 fils.

Credit cards: Major credit cards are widely accepted by car rental companies, the bigger stores, hotels and some restaurants, however you should carry some cash for general shopping and eating out at smaller establishments.

Exchange: There are no currency regulations and foreign currency of almost any denomination is readily exchanged in the UAE The dirham is index linked to the US dollar. 1\$ = Dhs 3.68. The exchange centres are found throughout the UAE such as the UAE Exchange Centre, opening hours are from 8:30am right through to 9:30pm, 365 days a year. Banks: Most Banks open at 8:00 am and close at 1:00 except Mashreq Bank who open until 4:15pm. They are closed all day Friday and public holidays.

SHOPPING/TIPPING: Bargaining is expected, especially in souqs, where prices can drop dramatically. Tipping is common for most services but it is not obligatory.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

Religious holidays are tied to the Islamic calendar and therefore dates vary. Friday is the Muslim holy day. Islamic Public Holidays are often not announced until a day or two before they occur:

(During the Holy Month restaurants and shops close during the day, and office hours during Ramadan are often reduced by two hours daily. The end of Ramadan is marked by Eid Al Fitr.)

Fujairah to Sharjah (King Faisal St)


