This has enhanced market transparency. Publishing the weekly inventory data is to set targets, including establishing Fujairah as the region pricing center, leading global & trading energy hub next to major pricing, trading and energy centers of the world.

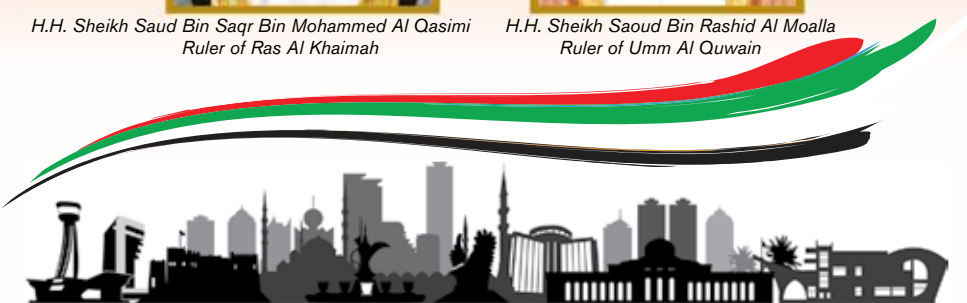

Ruler highlights solidarity, compassion of Emiratis on Flag Day



H.H. Sheikh Hamad bin Mohammed Al Sharqi, Supreme Council Member and Ruler of Fujairah, highlighted the importance of celebrating "Flag Day," which is a national occasion that reflects the solidarity and compassion of the Emirati people.

It is also an opportunity to express feelings of love and loyalty towards the UAE's Founder, the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, Sheikh Hamad added.

He made this statement while raising the flag in the front yard of the Ruler's Palace in Al Rumaila to celebrate Flag Day, in the presence of H.H. Sheikh Mohammed bin Hamad bin Mohammed Al Sharqi, Crown Prince of Fujairah, and H.H. Sheikh Maktoum bin Hamad Al Sharqi.

"Celebrating Flag Day each year highlights the importance of reiterating our loyalty to our nation, in light of the overall achievements witnessed by

the country, under the leadership of President His Highness Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan," Sheikh Hamad said.

Sheikh Hamad extended his greetings to His Highness Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed, and His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President, Prime Minister and Ruler of Dubai, and His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Deputy Supreme Commander of the UAE Armed Forces, and Their Highnesses Supreme Council Members and Rulers of the Emirates.



Ruler reviews progress of Dibba Sports Club Stadium project



H.H. Sheikh Hamad bin Mohammed Al Sharqi, Supreme Council Member and Ruler of Fujairah, reviewed the progress of the Dibba Fujairah Sports Club Stadium project in Al Ras, Dibba Fujairah, reflecting his keenness to monitor vital development projects that serve the emirate's citizens and residents.

During his visit, accompanied by Mohammed Saeed Al Dhanhani, Director of the Emiri Court of Fujairah, Ahmed Al Dhanhani, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Club, and several local officials, Sheikh Hamad was briefed by the project's field engineers and officials about the stadium's details, the progress of the work, and plans that were implemented using advanced technologies to meet the needs of the area's residents.

Sheikh Hamad stressed that the infrastructure projects currently being carried out in Fujairah are

in line with the economic and development needs of the local community, and meet the emirate's sustainable development requirements. The estimated cost of the project is some AED100 million.

Dibba Fujairah Sports Club Stadium, with a capacity of 10,000 spectators, is the newest in the country and meets the requirements of the UAE Pro League and the Asian Football Confederation for holding regional championships.



Ruler directs relevant authorities to accelerate work on Dibba Port



H.H. Sheikh Hamad bin Mohammed Al Sharqi, Supreme Council Member and Ruler of Fujairah, directed the relevant authorities to accelerate the pace of work on Phase I of the development of Dibba Fujairah Port, to make it a multi-purpose commercial port by the end of 2022.

He gave his instructions yesterday while visiting the port to review its progress, accompanied by Mohammed Saeed Al Dhanhani, Director of the Emiri Court of Fujairah, Captain Moussa Mourad, Director of Fujairah Port, and several local officials.

Sheikh Hamad was briefed by the project's field engineers and officials on their achievements and procedures, as well as their plans to complete the project's subsequent phases within the planned timeframe.

He then directed them to utilise the global technologies to complete the project.

Phase I of the project valued at AED800 million includes the construction of two 650-metre docks with a 18-metre depth and cranes with a capacity of 4,000 tonnes per hour, while eight berths will be constructed in the later phases to meet the requirements of all maritime commercial activities and increase the UAE's competitiveness in the field of high-capacity ports. A port for fishermen will also be constructed, enabling them to practice their livelihood.

The project is being implemented by four leading companies in the field of maritime docks, loading machines and port infrastructure.

The development of the port at an overall estimated cost of AED1.6 billion aims to facilitate the transportation of primary materials, to meet growing global demand and the requirements of all types of ships.

UAE is Official Member of IFA



Under the supervision of the Chairman of the Emirates Body Building and Fitness Federation H.H. Sheikh Abdullah bin Hamad bin Saif Al Sharqi, and the support of the Arab Armwrestling Federation AAF Founder President Mr. Karim EL Andary, the UAE has become an official member of the International Federation of Armwrestling IFA and the first member country in the Gulf region.

EL Andary gave the Certificate of membership to Sheikh Abdullah bin Hamad bin Saif Al Sharqi at the Federation's headquarters in Dubai in the presence of the Federation's board members and press.

During the meeting, major points were discussed in the aspect of developing Armwrestling sport and increasing the number of the practitioners in

the country in addition to organizing tournaments in the upcoming period.

Feisal Al Ghais, member of the board of directors of the Emirates Body Building and Fitness Federation described the joining of the UAE to the international Armwrestling community as an important step in the interest of popularisation of armwrestling in the country.

Stamps of Fujera: CHAPTER 4 May 1969 to 1971

Introduction: The original 5-year contract with Finbar Kenny was extended for a further 5 years even though the Ruler of Fujera was very unhappy with the way that Finbar was conducting the business. It appears that he was never available and was not paying the dues as per contract. The Ruler started looking at other options while the Fujera Stamps kept on rolling out!

APOLLO 8 Overprints

20th May 1969 - The original space set of May 1966 was overprinted APOLLO 8. Some values were also changed. The set was: 50np (even though they had changed to Dh!) 75np; 1R; 2R 2.50 R (on 25np); 3R (15 np); 4R (10 np) and 5R (5np). The Minisheet was also overprinted. All were available in Perf and Imperf format. Inverted overprints are known. The 2R stamp was also produced in Gold (perf and imperf) and imperf Prestige minisheet on stiff paper!

SAPPORO '72 Overprints

20th May 1969 - The original Winter Olympics set of January 1968 was overprinted SAPPORO '72 and Emblem. The set was: 25Dh; 50Dh; 75Dh; 1R; 1.50; 2R & 3R in both Perf and Imperf. Inverted overprints are known. No Minisheet was produced.

Birds

30th May 1969 – A set of 9 diamond-shaped values: 25Dh; 50Dh; 1R; 1.50 & 2R (Postage) & 1.25R; 2.50R; 3R & 5R as Airmails. All stamps were issued both Perf and Imperf. No minisheet was produced!

2nd June 1969: 25Dh; 50Dh; 1R; 1.50 & 2R (Postage) & 1.25R; 2.50R; 3R & 5R as Airmails. All stamps were issued both Perf and Imperf with no Minisheet. The 5R value was also produced in Gold as Perf and Imperf.

Champions of Peace

Dwight D Eisenhower

5th June 1969: 25Dh; 50Dh; 75Dh; 1R; 2R; 3R & 5R (Postage). All stamps were issued both Perf and Imperf with

no Minisheet. The 25Dh value (Churchill) was also produced on Gold Foil as Perf; Imperf and Delux Imperf. Note – these gold stamps are on FDC dated 24th April 1969 – 2 weeks before the official issue of the regular stamps.

International Human Rights

The same regular stamps were also issued on the same 5th June overprinted: 'INTERNATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS YEAR' (in Perf and Imperf). No Gold stamp is known of these overprinted stamps.

Wild Flowers

5th June 1969: 25Dh; 50Dh; 1R; 1.50 & 2R (Postage) & 1.25R; 2.50R; 3R & 5R as Airmails. All stamps were issued both Perf and Imperf. For the 5th set in a row, no minisheet was produced!

Apollo Space Flights

5th June 1969: 10Dh; 25Dh; 50Dh; 1R & 2R (Postage) & 2.50R; 3R; 4R & 5R as Airmails. All stamps were issued both Perf and Imperf. The 4 Airmail stamps were also produced as a Minisheet with the stamps saying Postage. The 5R stamp was also produced on Gold foil in Perf, Imperf and Imperf Delux.

Apollo 10 overprints

5th June 1969: Stamps and Minisheet from previous set were overprinted APOLLO 10. The overprinted 2.50R stamp was also produced on Gold foil in Perf, Imperf and Imperf Delux.

MOON LANDING overprints

22nd September 1969: Original Stamps and Minisheet from previous set were overprinted MOON LANDING. The overprinted 2.50R stamp was also produced on Gold foil in Perf, Imperf and Imperf Delux.

Apollo 11 – 3 different overprints

22nd September 1969: The top row of the sheets of the original Perf Stamps were overprinted:

'FIRST MEN/ON THE MOON'; the second row: 'APOLLO 11/MOON/FLIGHT' and the third row: 'NEIL/ARMSTRONG/EDWIN/ALDRIN JR./MICHAEL/COLLINS'. The order was inverted on the Imperf stamps! The 3 overprints were used on the single Minisheet with an additional overprint: 'MOON/APOLLO 11/FLIGHT'. The 50 Dh 'FIRST MEN/ON THE MOON' stamp was also made available on Gold Foil in Perf, Imperf and Delux Imperf.

There are numerous errors reported of these overprints. The main ones are inverted overprints and the Apollo 11 overprints printed on already overprinted stamps instead of the original 'clean' issues. The Minisheet is also known with 2 different overprints.

Napoleon

6th April 1970: 15Dh; 25Dh; 50Dh; 75Dh; 1R; 1.50R & 2R 'Postage' stamps. The 2 highest values were also produced in an 'Airmail' Minisheet. All were produced in both Perf and Imperf format. The 50Dh value was also produced on Gold Foil perf, imperf and Imperf Delux on thick board.

De Gaulle

15th April 1970: 35Dh; 60Dh; 75Dh; 1.25R; 2.50R; 3R & 5R 'Postage' stamps. The 2 highest values were also produced in an 'Airmail' Minisheet. All are available in both Perf and Imperf formats.

Bible

25th April 1970: 15Dh and 1R 'Postage' and 35Dh; 75Dh; 1.25R; 1.50R; 2.50R & 3R 'Air Mail' stamps; Plus Minisheet containing the 2.50R; & 3.R stamps. All is available in Perf and Imperf.

EXPO '70

30th April 1970: 15Dh; 25Dh; 50Dh; 75Dh; 1R & 2R 'Postage' and 75Dh; 1.25R; 2.50R & 4R 'Air Mail' stamps; Plus

The contract with Finbar Kenny was terminated on 3rd May and approval was granted to produce agreed stamps up to 9th May. All issues mentioned here are those approved officially. All these issues come cancelled with the hexagonal cancel. While issues under the new contract are cancelled with a circular cancel.

2 Minisheets containing the top 2 'Postage' stamps as 'Air Mail' and the top 2 'Airmail' stamps as 'Postage'. All is available in Perf and Imperf.

EXPO '70

30th April 1970: 15Dh; 25Dh; 50Dh; 75Dh; 1R & 2R "Postage" and 75Dh; 1.25R; 2.50R & 4R 'Air Mail' stamps; Plus 2 Minisheets containing the top 2 'Postage' stamps as 'Air Mail' and the top 2 'Airmail' stamps as 'Postage'. All is available in Perf and Imperf.

NEW CONTRACT

On 3rd May 1970, the Ruler of Fujaira, Mohammad Bin Hamad Alsharqi, signed a new contract for Postal administration with Middle East Stamps of Beirut through Mr Hage from Lebanon. This was not taken very favourably by the previous administrator Finbar Kenny. He threatened legal action because there was no Early Termination clause in the old contract. In return, the Government allowed Finbar Kenny to still produce the next space issue that had already been agreed on and the stamps already produced. These issued on 9th May. The sets were:

also produced on Gold and on Silver Foils as Perf, Imperf and Delux Imperf of each type!

APOLLO 13

9th May 1970: All stamps overprinted with a Silver Emblem of Apollo 13 and 'SAFE LANDING'. The 5R value was also produced on Gold and on Silver Foils as Perf, Imperf and Delux Imperf!

APOLLO 14

9th May 1970: Original stamps overprinted in Gold 'APOLLO 14/PROJECT'. The 2R value was also produced on Gold and on Silver Foils as Perf, Imperf and Delux Imperf!

APOLLO 12

9th May 1970: 25Dh; 50Dh; 75Dh; 1R; 2R; 3R; 4R & 5R 'Postage' stamps; Plus the top 4 values were also issued in an 'Airmail' Minisheet. All is available in Perf and Imperf. The 3R value was

was terminated on 9th May. He issued a few circulars and sent them to his previous clients and Philatelic magazines stating of the illegal other 'labels' produced illegally by other parties. For these circulars please refer to the internet site: <http://www.ohmygosh.on.ca/stamps/fujairah/fujann1.htm> where these circulars are given in their entirety. They document how Kenny was fighting back claiming that they are running the official Post Office in Fujaira.

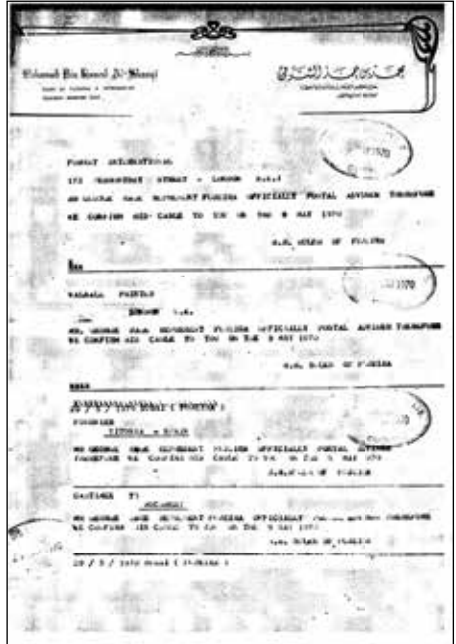
Kenny produced many other issues after 9th May and these were illegal. Issues include Apollo 13&14 issue; English Personalities; American Personalities; German Personalities; UN; Education Year; Scouts; Dickens; Red Cross; Centenary of British Red Cross; IOC; Munich Olympics; Mexico World Cup; Brazil Winners; Expo 70; Expo 70 on Gold foil.

At the same time, the Ruler of Fujaira was sending out circulars to dealers and Philatelic press to tell everyone of the change in administration. He also organised telexes to all major Stamp printing houses explaining the situation and asking them to stop supplying stamps to Mr Kenny. Some are reproduced here.

The Post Office cancel was changed by the Ruler to a circular cancel. But Kenny was still using the Hexagonal cancel on the envelopes he was using and sending to clients and dealers. And the same applies to the cancel on CTO stamps – all issues mentioned above by Kenny have the Hexagonal cancel. Examples of the Hexagonal cancels after this date are indications that those stamps emanated from Mr Kinbar illegally.

PR at a glance

PR is everywhere, and it’s a huge part of how major brands operate. However, it’s also essential for smaller businesses. (Business Element)

In my opinion, PR is a vital and quintessential tool for every developing brand or business starting their endeavours. A powerful PR team will no doubt will generate a giant audience, and will ultimately dwarf any audiences generated through regular marketing and advertising. The outreach that a powerful PR team can create is imperative for any new business or enterprise to succeed. With PR, you are not only reaching the individuals in masses, you are reaching entities that have their own masses and audience. This method of mega targeting is immensely more effective than typical advertising and marketing

techniques and strategies. Of course, I am not saying that traditional Marketing and Advertising practices are dead, they are still alive and well; however, with the new digital age the creation of new platforms, such as podcasts, digital media, and social media platforms where influencers are engaging in heavily and have a huge follower base, engaging in PR practices proves to be by far more effective than advertising on billboards, radio, or even TV and newspapers.



PR: Public is Power

Public Relation specialists will generally target audiences that are interested in the line of business you are in. For example, if you are starting a franchise chain, it is very important and recommended that you reach out and contract with a good PR firm. In this example, the PR firm will contact food bloggers, food podcast platforms, food magazines, and food network circles(such as established chefs, food events, organizations that have to do with food, and

restaurant establishments). By setting up the right buzz, with the perfect timing, you develop the ability to create the perfect storm for a booming and thriving business, with the right crowds targeted. This targeted approach will ultimately lead to leads, with a high sales conversion rate.

"If a young man tells his date how handsome, smart and successful he is – that's advertising. If the young man tells his date she's intelligent, looks lovely, and is a great conversationalist, he's saying the right things to the right person and that's marketing. If someone else tells the young woman how handsome, smart and successful her date is – that's PR." – S. H. Simmons.

The difference between advertising and Public Relations, as I see it, is that advertising is generally paid for. A company can set an annual advertising budget and rent ad space in a variety of channels, including newspapers, magazines, radio ad slots, TV ad slots, billboards spaces, and much more. With advertising, firms build exposure. By contrast, with PR, firms build trust. Whereas with advertising, audiences might be found to be skeptical, PR provides an invaluable commodity in creating third party validation. With paid advertising, delivery of your ads to the target audience is never really guaranteed. However, in a successful PR campaign, an entity or business manages to persuade the media for coverage and placement. While some argue that it's hard to see the value of PR because there isn't always an immediate ROI, PR's true value lies in its ability to shape and influence people's attitudes, actions and behaviors. (*Forbes*)



PR is by far the most effective way to establish credibility and gain genuine interest and media coverage in order to generate a frenzy buzz in the sector you are operating in. When a business

chooses the PR route, it is creating relationships and connections with the necessary parties to get the attention the business needs and deserves, from the right audiences.

Selective targeting, the process of targeting the desired audience you want, be it high income earners to buy your newest high tech gadget, or to target the crowds that like your cuisine for one of your restaurants, or even targeting the influencers that will set a precedent, cause a buzz, a frenzy, and be the electrical talk of the town, which will ultimately generate traffic, followers, and leads, which will eventually convert to sales. The current trend in influencer marketing is set to grow even further, with brands set to spend up to \$15 billion on influencer marketing by 2022 (up from \$8 billion in 2019), per Business Insider Intelligence estimates, based on Mediakix data.

Parting Words

In Conclusion, I strongly believe an effective PR approach will be the most beneficial to any new entrepreneur starting a business. The wise use of financial resources in an effort to engage in selective targeting, rather than going out on a marketing or advertising spending splurge, can make or break a new enterprise. Word to the wise: When it comes to PR and its utility in branding your business or enterprise, take your time, do the research, assemble the right team, and do it right.

The world's Largest wooden Arabic dhow



A mighty dhow sails off the shore of Dubai, recognised as the world's largest. It is almost the size of an American football field floating in the Indian Ocean

Named 'Obaid', in reference to Obaid Jumaa bin Majid Al Falasi, an Emirati shipbuilder who began an apprenticeship at the age of nine in the mid-1940s, the Largest wooden Arabic dhow in the world was verified by Guinness World Records on 28th October 2020 in Dubai.

The majestic dhow measures 91.47 m long and 20.41 m wide. To visualize this, it is the length and almost half the width of a standard American football field, floating over the Indian Ocean. Hypothetically speaking, balancing this huge structure on either its bow or stern vertically would make this dhow stand almost as tall as the Big Ben in London.

Building a big handmade boat in a country with no forests is a challenge, but crafting the world's

largest dhow is a challenge on a higher level. Decades on from the heyday of the Creek's trading boats, a family-run yard still produces traditional hand-built vessels – and most importantly has just been recognized with the Guinness World Records title of the Largest wooden Arabic dhow.

Work on the majestic dhow started years ago, with no actual engineering vision or blueprints but was massively developed and scaled up. Local craftsmen say they own the experience, describing it as the 'art of dhow building'.

According to Majid Obaid Al Falasi, aged 52, it is not for prestige that drove him to build the largest dhow, but for his late father, Obaid Jumaa bin Majid Al Falasi.

"Our forefathers were divers, our ancestors worked in the sea, and my own father perused this craftsmanship for almost all his life. This is a gratitude to my father, and my country which always aims for the forefront positions," says Majid Obaid.

“We tried to get the longest pieces of log available. We are born as dhow builders, and can build dhows using other material, but wood keeps its identity. This achievement is just the inevitable continuation for building dhows in the world,” he added.

A modern adaptation is adding steel to the wooden structure. The majestic dhow is larger and stronger than a traditional one, and will be able to carry four times more cargo in and out from Dubai’s docks.

“I see it in the eyes of my son. He is passionate about what I do, and what his grandfather used to do. This is what matters, for them to be able to continue the tradition and have it transferred to the next generation,” he elaborated.

The dhow stands at a height of 11.229 meters, and it weighs 2500 tonnes. It has been constructed from material sourced both locally and abroad and will have an estimated load capacity of up to 6,000 tonnes. There might be around 1700 tonnes of wood, and 800 tonnes of

steel. The wood was brought from Africa, and it is mainly a jungle wood, as only nearly half of what you buy is usable.

Apart from the years of commitment and tens of dedicated skilful craftsmen, this iconic sailing vessel cost comes from the expenses of wood imports, and hundreds of thousands of nuts, bolts, screws and nails.

The dhow is powered by two 1850 horsepower engines and will be used to transport cargo from the UAE to Yemen, Somalia, Sudan, Egypt, Kenya, Pakistan, India, and maybe Iraq. “At a speed of 14 knots, it will be enough for this dhow to operate and achieve its desired ROI. Who knows, you might see this dhow docking at different ports all across the world.”

Magan Consultant Heritage published the book.

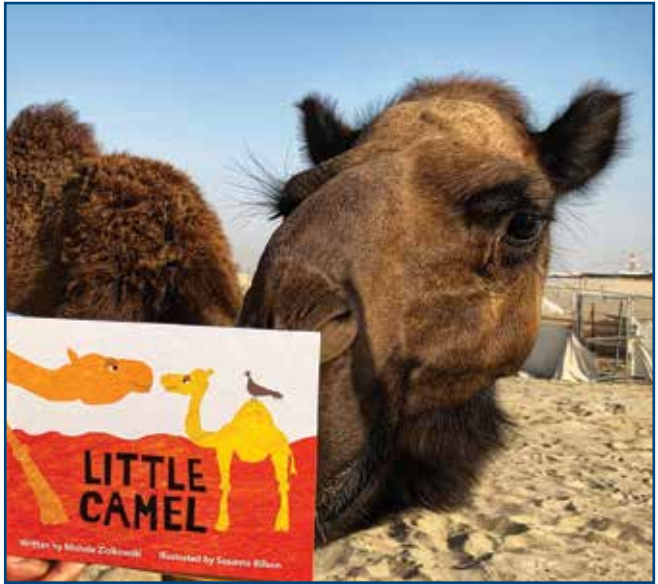
What age group is the book aimed at?

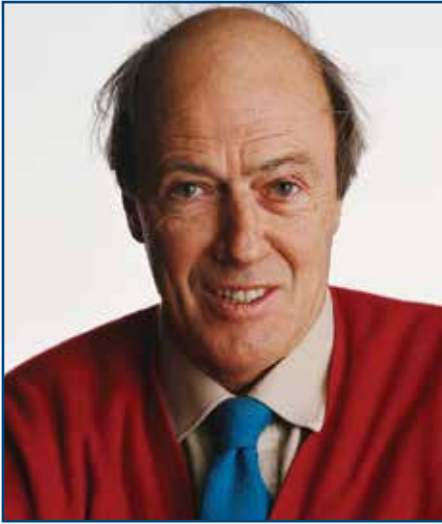

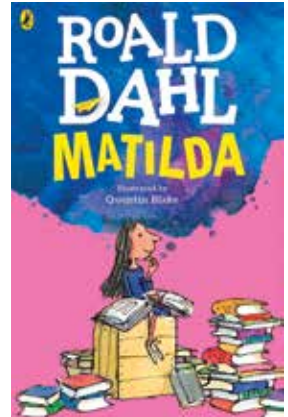

Toastmasters International – 96 Years Journey of Excellence

In October 2020, Toastmasters International celebrated the 96th Anniversary. But, many of us don't know what is the real reason behind starting this organization?

Fujairah Toastmasters Club pays the tributes to the Founders of Toastmasters International on 96th Anniversary by recollecting the history of Toastmasters International.

The Toastmasters Journey

Toastmasters began as a series of speaking clubs organized by **Ralph C. Smedley** during his time working for the YMCA (Young Men's Christian Association) in Bloomington, Illinois, United States. As director of education at the YMCA, Smedley saw a need for the men in the community to learn how to speak, conduct meetings, plan programs and work on committees, and he wanted to help them.

Smedley decided to organize a club where they could learn these skills in a social environment, and the men responded well to the concept. He named the group the Toastmasters Club; "toastmaster" was a popular term that referred to a person who gave toasts at banquets and other occasions.

The first unofficial Toastmasters meeting was held on March 24, 1905. Much like Toastmasters meetings today, the participants took turns leading and speaking at each meeting. Smedley and the older, more experienced men evaluated short speeches, while the younger men were invited to join in the evaluations. However, as Smedley was offered positions at other YMCAs in Illinois and later, in San Jose, California, the fledgeling clubs lacked leadership and did not flourish.

The Forming of Toastmasters International

Smedley began working at the newly organized YMCA in Santa Ana, California, in 1922, and for the first two years, his time was spent building a home for the organization. However, his passion to help others learn to speak and lead remained. Once the new YMCA building was christened in April of 1924, he was able to introduce the idea of Toastmasters to his colleagues, and organize the Toastmasters club that eventually became Club No. 1 of Toastmasters International. The first meeting was held at the YMCA building on October 22, 1924. Word spread about Smedley's Toastmasters clubs and soon people

in surrounding communities and other states were asking how they could start their club.

To save time replying to the many letters and inquiries he was receiving, Smedley wrote the "Manual of Instructions" and "Ten Lessons in Public Speaking," which he had printed and bound in paper covers. On October 25, 1928, he secured copyrights on the publications and trademarked the name "Toastmasters Club."

By 1930, nearly 30 Toastmasters clubs had formed including a club in British Columbia, Canada. To reflect expansion outside of the

United States, the newly formed association was re-named Toastmasters International. Two years later, in 1932, Toastmasters International was incorporated as a California non-profit organization and Smedley took on the positions of Secretary and Editor of the new association.

He resigned as YMCA Secretary in 1941 to devote more time to Toastmasters. Through the war years, he operated the organization out of a small office. When the war ended, a new Secretary, Ted Blanding, replaced Smedley and remained active as Educational Director for the rest of his life, as well as a permanent member of the Board of Directors.

Currently, Toastmasters International have 364,000+ members in more than 16,200 clubs in 145 countries. Since 1924, Toastmasters International has helped people from diverse backgrounds become more confident speakers, communicators, and leaders.

The Geological Trail - Al Hajar Mountains



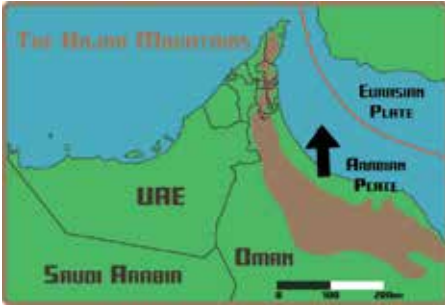
The Al Hajar mountains (which translate to the Rocky or Stone mountains) are the highest mountain range in the eastern Arabian peninsula. Spanning the 2 countries of Oman and the UAE, they stretch 700km along the Gulf of Oman. At 3009m the highest point in the range is Jebel Shams, located about 240km West of Muscat, Oman. Fujairah's highest point is Jabal Al-Mebra, also known as Jabal Yibir at 1,727 m

Their formation is due to plate tectonics. The Eurasian and Arabian plates moving against each other. These are currently stable plates and there is very little chance of significant earthquake's in the region. The Arabian Plate (which includes

Fujairah) is moving north relative to the Eurasian Plate at about 2–3 cm per year.

The mountains were formed throughout the Mesozoic period, starting their formation 245 million years ago and taking a mere 180 million years for completion. In this time, they will have witnessed the Triassic, Jurassic and Cretaceous periods and the evolution of dinosaurs, mammals and birds. Unfortunately, they will also have witnessed the dinosaur's demise. There is no evidence (such as fossils) that dinosaurs inhabited this part of the world. Mankind's evolution wouldn't be for another 60 million years after the Hajar mountains formation.

The rocks that form the Hajar mountains were originally on the sea floor and covered by between 500m and 1000m of sea water. The sea level didn't drop but the plates pushing against each other forced the rocks up and formed the mountains we know today.



Sedimentary

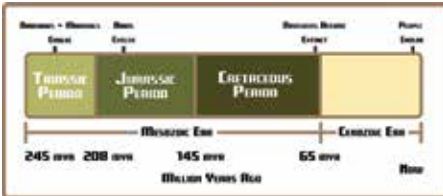
Sedimentary rocks are types of rock that are formed by the accumulation or deposition of mineral or organic particles at the Earth's surface, followed by cementation. Sedimentary rocks found in Fujairah are limestone, chert, shale and mudstone.

The limestone quarried in Fujairah has multiple uses and can be used in the production of paper, pharmaceuticals, chicken feed, steel, iron, fertilizer and cement.

About 75% of Fujairah is mountainous. Coastal planes, beaches and desert make up the remaining 25%.

In the west of Fujairah and stretching across all the other 6 Emirates is desert. A brief history of a desert's formation is that it is sand formed from rocks that have been eroded and exposed to intense weathering for a long time, with no rain and extremely high temperatures. The desert of the UAE is younger than the Hajar mountains.

Cement used in the construction of the Burj Khalifa originated in Fujairah, this was because of its reputation in being the finest, purest (high grade) limestone. The grey limestone in particular is the best source for cement. This limestone as cement and a raw material is exported to India and all over Gulf region.



There are 3 main categories of rock in Fujairah

Igneous

The igneous rocks are formed from the cooling of lava magma. Shamal chert is prevalent in the north of Fujairah and is a volcanic rock formed from lava. There were no volcanos in the area but merely breaks in the earth's surface in which the lava flowed before cooling. You might be lucky enough to find a crystal in the mountains. This might be a piece of quartz and it is a crystal not a rock. They are formed in nature when liquids cool and start to harden. These crystals will have formed as a result of the liquid rock, called magma, cooling.

The process of making cement is quite a simple one

- The first step is to quarry the principal raw materials, which is mainly limestone.
- After quarrying, the rock is crushed to a size about 3 inches or smaller.
- The crushed rock is combined with other ingredients such as iron ore and ground, mixed, and fed to a cement kiln.
- The cement kiln heats all the ingredients to about 2,700 degrees Fahrenheit in huge cylindrical steel rotary kilns lined with special firebrick.
- As the material moves through the kiln, certain elements are driven off in the form of gases. The remaining elements unite to form a new substance called clinker. Clinker comes out of the kiln as grey balls, about the size of marbles.
- Clinker is discharged red-hot from the lower end of the kiln and generally is brought down to handling temperature in various types of coolers. The heated air from the coolers is returned to the kilns, a process that saves



fuel and increases burning efficiency.

- After the clinker is cooled, cement plants grind it and mix it with small amounts of gypsum and limestone. Cement is so fine that 1 pound of cement contains 150 billion grains. The cement is now ready for transport to ready-mix concrete companies to be used in a variety of construction projects.

Chert is only in found in the northern part of Fujairah. The same rock has different colourings due to oxidation.

- If the rock is red, it is chert with a high iron oxide content.
- If it is green, once again it is chert but with aluminum oxidation.

Metamorphic

Metamorphic rocks started out as some other type of rock, but have been substantially changed from their original igneous, sedimentary, or earlier metamorphic form. Metamorphic rocks form when

rocks are subjected to high heat, high pressure, hot mineral-rich fluids or, more commonly, some combination of these factors. An example of this is marble rock formed when limestone is exposed to high temperatures and pressures.

As a general rule, the rocks in Fujairah can be classified by region.

- In the north the rocks are hard igneous and sedimentary.
- In the central region they are largely metamorphic rocks.
- In the south are they are ophiolites and mostly igneous

Caves are more prevalent in the North and formed within sedimentary rocks.

On your adventurous walks in the north of Fujairah you might well see rocks that look like a mix of 2 different rocks. These are called melange, a mixed rock containing both limestone and chert. The two rocks will have been forced together over time and under significant pressure. Giving the appearance of a single rock.

Fujairah's Petroglyphs are carved into weathered limestone. The rocks themselves are grey all the way through but their exterior surface is darkened due to sun and heat.

The rocks you will see on the surface of the mountains will broadly fall into either smooth rock or sharp rocks. Don't let their appearance fool you into thinking they are different rocks. They may well be the same but one has had the erosion of time smoothing it off and the other maybe recently has been exposed or broken off a larger rock. If you look at the mountains from a distance you will see mostly brown rocks and these (similar to the limestone petroglyphs) are darkened by the intense and continual heat they are subjected to.

Mining and crusher activity in Fujairah started with easily accessible rock from wadies and was a lot less industrious than the business we see today.

Next time you are paddling in the sea, thinking how relaxing it is having the sand between your



toes. Think about this. The beach sand came from the Hajar mountains with rocks washed down the wadies and eroded into what we now see as sand. The flatter coastal plain area between the sea and mountains are larger stones that still would have originated in the Hajar's.

Dyslexia and the Occupational Therapist role

Reading is a learnt skill and children typically do not read until they are taught to do so. The process of learning to read begins in early childhood when children are exposed to baby books. Later the learning process focuses on the alphabet and on how to put letters together to make words and sentences.

Some children may be slow to read because of lack of opportunities or language delay. Children with dyslexia have a difficulty reading due to structural differences in the way their brain processes written language and graphic symbols.

Typically, a dyslexic child will have problems with word recognition, spelling and decoding as well as the speed with which the brain performs these tasks.

Symptoms of dyslexia in children

Since dyslexia is a learning disability, it can be difficult to recognise its symptoms before the child begins school. Some common dyslexia symptoms include:

- Difficulty reading single words, such as a word on a flashcard
- Difficulty learning the connection between letters and sounds
- Confusing small words, such as 'at' and 'to'
- Letter reversals, such as 'd' for 'b'
- Word reversals, such as 'tip' for 'pit'

Letter reversals in preschool alone are not a sign of dyslexia if there is no other reading difficulty. Dyslexia is diagnosed through a complex testing process. Dyslexia diagnostic tests are usually for children aged six and above.

Does dyslexia affect the child's academic performance and what can be done to get better? Reading is an important life skill and is required to learn all subjects in school, whether it is English language, second language, science or maths. Therefore, dyslexia can affect learning

and academic performance if the condition is not identified, and intervention is not provided, at an early stage.

Without intervention, the reading demands just increase as the child progresses through school and learning and understanding just gets more difficult. Learning a second language is often very difficult for dyslexic children.

Despite the challenges, many dyslexic children do very well in school. Key factors are early identification, good quality intervention and very supportive parents and teachers.

Dyslexia is a lifelong reading disability with good potential for improvement. Dyslexia management involves intervention through teaching rather than medication.

Occupational therapists are in a unique position to support a dyslexic child's learning by addressing key components of skills such as oculomotor function, executive functioning, and motor coordination. By improving underlying visual perceptual skills, motor abilities and attention using compensatory skills and alternative methods of learning to improve academic performance.

A dyslexic child can overcome his reading difficulty with special training from professionals. Parental support and encouragement are also key factors in dyslexia treatment. Since the prevailing methods used to teach reading are not adequate for the dyslexic child, dyslexic children are likely to feel distressed because they can't read like their friends. Parents can help boost their confidence by helping them discover other talents and develop these.

Man sells meteorite that crashed through his roof for over \$1 million

An Indonesian man turned an unusual bit of property damage into a fortune when he sold the meteorite that crashed through his roof for over \$1 million.

Josua Hutagalung, 33, said he was working outside his home in Sumatra when the meteorite crashed through the roof of the house and was still warm when he picked it up.

The 4.5-pound chunk of CM1/2 carbonaceous chondrite, a rare variety of meteorite, was valued at \$1,858,556 by experts and attracted the attention of U.S. expert Jared Collins, who purchased the meteorite and resold it to fellow U.S. collector Jay Piatek.

Hutagalung did not disclose the amount that he was paid for the meteorite, but he indicated it was over \$1 million. He said the money will allow his family to expand and he also plans to donate some toward the building of a local church.



UAE woman visits all seven continents, breaks Guinness record

A UAE woman broke a Guinness World Record when she visited all seven continents in 3 days, 14 hours, 46 minutes and 48 seconds.

Khawla AlRomaithi completed her whirlwind tour of the globe in Sydney, Australia, on February 13th, shortly before travel restrictions related to the COVID-19 pandemic went into effect.

"It was a difficult journey; the attempt demanded a lot of patience, especially in airports, as well as having to deal with constant plane rides," AlRomaithi said.

She said she was inspired to attempt the record by the diversity of her home country.

"The UAE is home to around 200 different nationalities, I wanted to visit their countries and learn about their cultures and traditions," she said.



Robot wolves protecting Japanese town from bears

A Japanese town is protecting itself from wandering bears with a pair of unusual guardians: motion-detecting robot wolves.

Officials in Takikawa, on the island of Hokkaido, said concern about an increase of bear incursions into residential neighbourhoods this year led to their purchasing two Monster Wolves, robotic guard canines created by machinery firm Ohta Seiki in partnership with a local university.

The Monster Wolves, which are made of metal and covered in fake fur to make them appear real to other animals, are outfitted with motion detectors that cause them to activate. The wolves then flash red lights in their eyes, move their heads back and forth and emit a series of howling and screeching noises.

City officials said the wolves have thus far been effective in preventing bears from entering the town. Wolves once lived in the wild in Japan, but went extinct in the country during the early 20th century.



School asks parents to stop throwing late students over closed gate

An elementary school in France put up a pair of posters outside their fence with an unusual request for parents: Don't throw late students over the closed gate.

The Trillade school in Avignon put up signs outside its gate showing a cartoon of a parent sending a small child airborne to get over the fence. The text on the sign asks parents not to throw their children, and instead wait for the gates to be opened again at 10 a.m. or 3 p.m.

Principal Sanaa Meziane said that parents "literally threw their children" over the gate when they arrived to find it closed.



Border guards in NW China turn gardeners on snow-covered plateau

Chinese soldiers in Northwest China's Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region have successfully grown vegetables on the 4,050-meter-high plateau, despite having only three hours of sunshine each day.

The soldiers are from a border defense troop stationed between the snowy mountains in Xinjiang's Kashi.

Despite the lack of sunshine and cold weather, they set up greenhouses covered with thick cotton quilts, and managed to grow vegetables such as green beans, eggplants and mushrooms, all of which require high temperatures, humidity and sunshine. They have even been able to raise ducks.

To ensure a suitable temperature for the vegetables, they burn coal to heat up the greenhouse once every hour, the soldiers explained.

The output can basically meet the daily needs of the troop, who can then save up to buy more non-staple foodstuff.



Extremely rare white giraffe gets tracker after poachers killed its family

An extremely rare white giraffe has been fitted with a tracking device for its protection after its family was killed by poachers.

The giraffe, in the Ishaqbini Hirola Conservancy in southeast Kenya, has a rare genetic condition called leucism that causes partial loss of pigmentation in its skin. It was fitted with a tracking device on one of its horns on November 8th.

The device will send hourly updates on the animal's whereabouts, so rangers can monitor its movements on a daily basis and keep it safe from poachers.

The unusual coloration makes the animal dangerously vulnerable to poachers in the wilderness.

Two other white giraffes in the conservancy, a female and her calf, were killed by poachers in March 2020, the trust said, and concerns are mounting for the remaining animal.

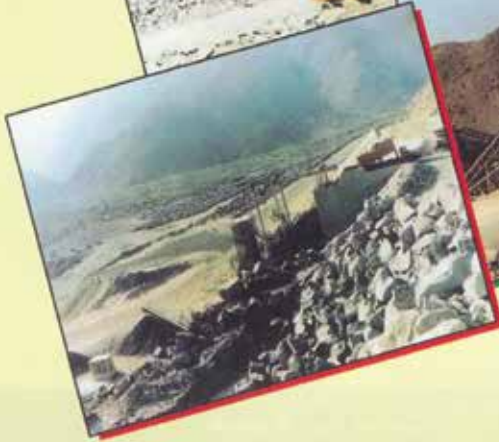
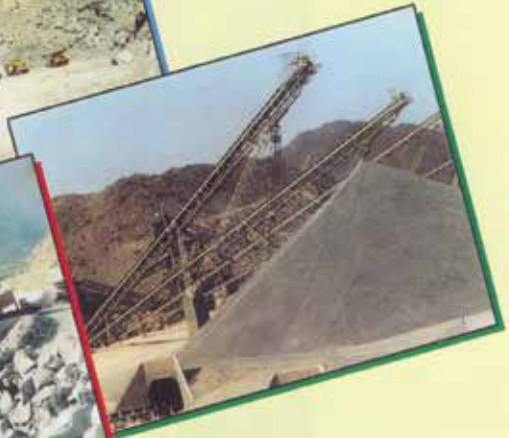

on a wakeboard achieving an impressive 21 m (68.89 ft) jump, smashing the previous record that stood at 15 meters set by Jérôme Macquart (France) in 2004. Almheiri also smashed another GWR title on the same day for Most wakeboard rail airs in 30 seconds achieving 10 in total, doubling the previous record also set by Jerome MacQuart (France) in 2005.

"If there is one thing that I learned from this experience, it is that we hold a big responsibility to inspire the younger generation, to transfer the message and share the passion. Having this global recognition in hand makes me proud as an Emirati, as this is certainly the jewel in the crown of so many years of achievement and success," said Almheiri.

Twenty three young Omeir has known wakeboarding almost as long as he can remember. He has been the uninterrupted champion of the UAE Open Men National between 2012 and

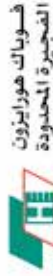

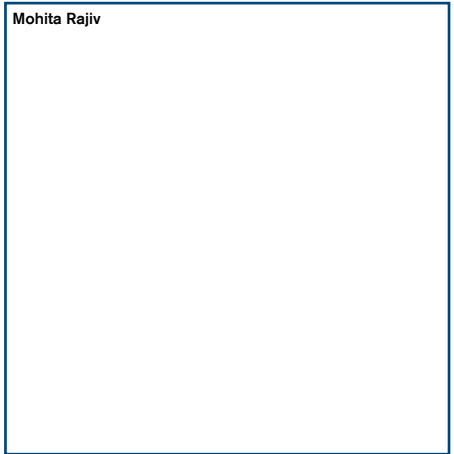

CLIMATE: The sun shines year round but Oct. to March, the days are pleasant (26°C, nights 15°C) Summer is April to Sept. and temperatures peak around 50°C with high humidity. The sun can be fierce so heatstroke, heat exhaustion are always a risk. Sunglasses, hats, and high factor sun creams are essential, especially for children.

DRESS: As in many Arab/Muslim countries dress should be modest. Wearing revealing tops or shorts in public places is not advisable.

CURRENCY: The dirham (pronounced dir-ham) is the UAE official currency. Dirham notes are in 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500, and 1000 denominations. The dirham is divided into 100 fils. Coins are 1 dirham, 50, 25, 10 and 5 fils.

Credit cards: Major credit cards are widely accepted by car rental companies, the bigger stores, hotels and some restaurants, however you should carry some cash for general shopping and eating out at smaller establishments.

Exchange: There are no currency regulations and foreign currency of almost any denomination is readily exchanged in the UAE The dirham is index linked to the US dollar. 1\$ = Dhs 3.68. The exchange centres are found throughout the UAE such as the UAE Exchange Centre, opening hours are from 8:30am right through to 9:30pm, 365 days a year. Banks: Most Banks open at 8:00 am and close at 1:00 except Mashreq Bank who open until 4:15pm. They are closed all day Friday and public holidays.

SHOPPING/TIPPING: Bargaining is expected, especially in souqs, where prices can drop dramatically. Tipping is common for most services but it is not obligatory.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

Religious holidays are tied to the Islamic calendar and therefore dates vary. Friday is the Muslim holy day. Islamic Public Holidays are often not announced until a day or two before they occur:

(During the Holy Month restaurants and shops close during the day, and office hours during Ramadan are often reduced by two hours daily. The end of Ramadan is marked by Eid Al Fitr.)

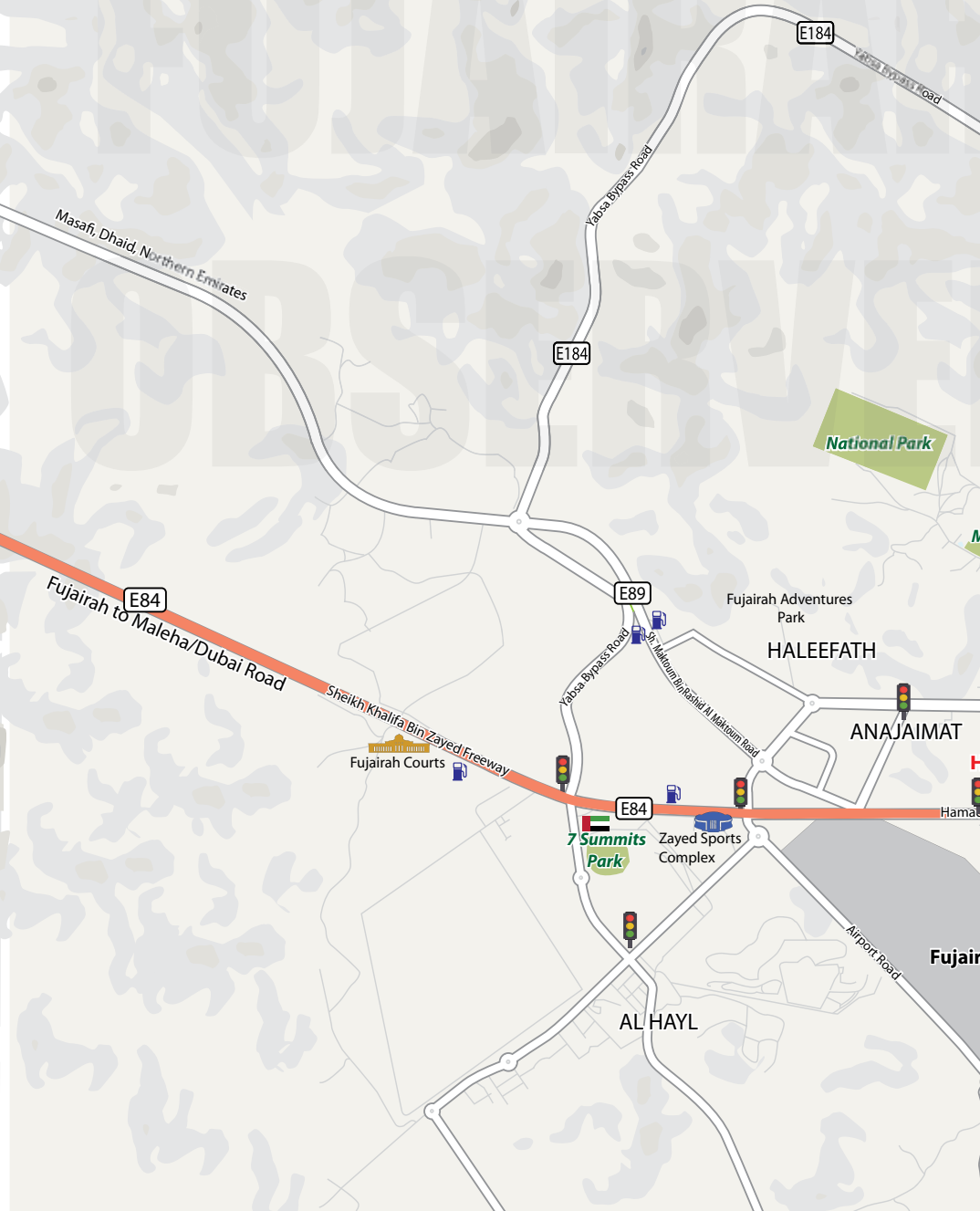

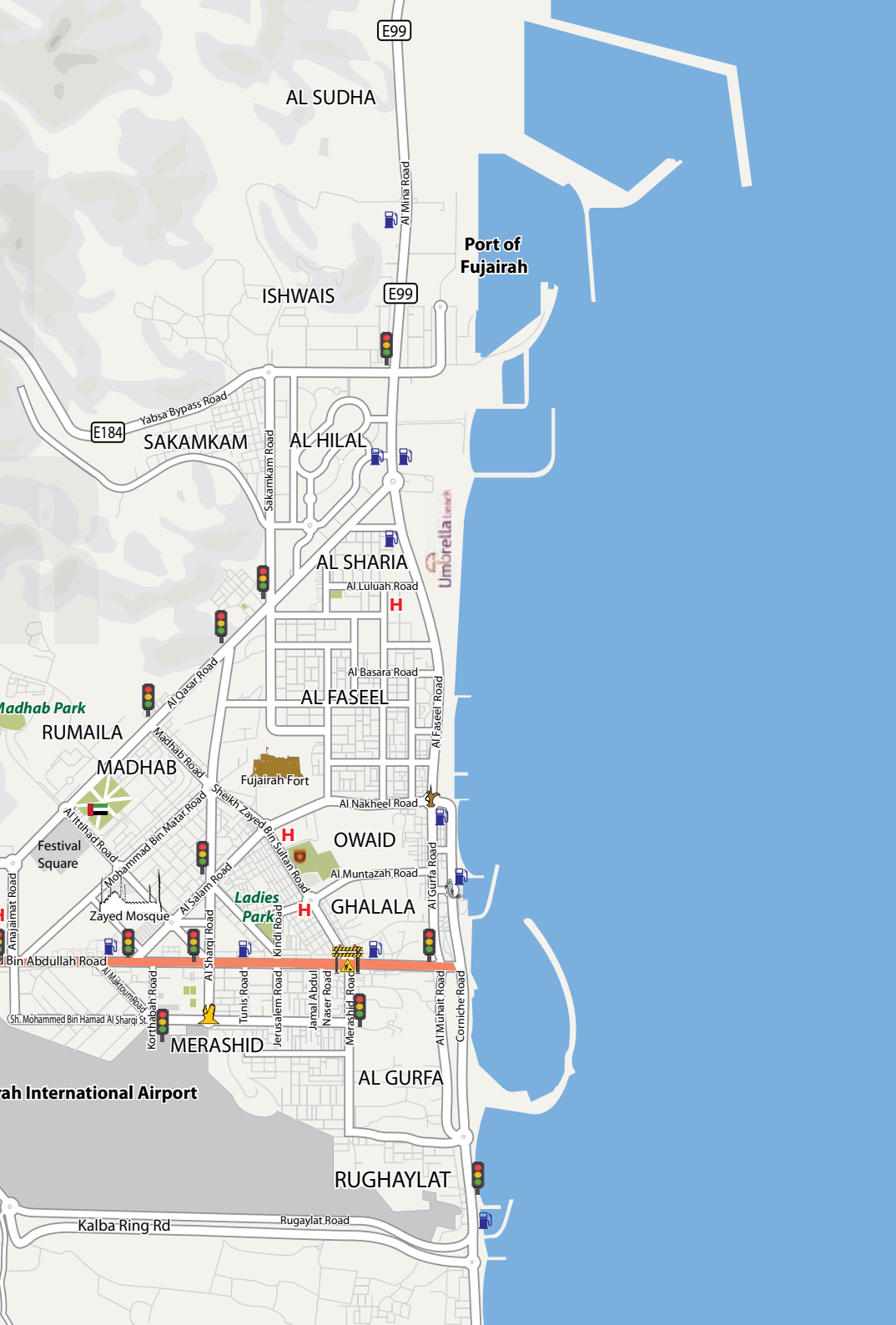
